Thank you so much for purchasing my "Work On Writing: August/September Edition" packet! The activities included in this packet have been so impactful in my students success during Work on Writing time. I hope that you and your students enjoy and find them as useful as I do!!

Included in this packet are the following activities:

- •Imagination station
 - •List It!
- •Complete the Thought...
 - •Pen Pal
 - Writing papers

On the following page, you will find some suggestions of ways to use these tools/set it up.

**Note: In this document, WoW stands for Work on Writing.

The Set Up

Currently, I have my work on writing section set up to look something like this...
**Note: Using a bulletin board or tri-fold display board and a set of drawers/cubbies next to the board would also work!

I punch holes & then put each different type of task card set is on it's own key ring.



I have the students keep the work that they are working on in these folders. Completed work is turned in/ taken home.

I put the imagination station pages in this bin.

When to use these Work On Writing activities! I have used these stations in 2 ways. One, I have incorporated them into my literacy stations. Two, I have used them is as part of my fast finishers activities/stations.

Inagination Station!

How to use:


- I. Each page can be used as an individual whole group activity
- 2. OR have it be an option for students to do when they come to their work on writing for the week

If done as option #2 from above

- This is one of the 2 activities in these work on writing tools packet that gets changed weekly. Everything else is used for the whole month.
- Each week when they students go to work on writing, one activity they can do is "Imagination Station!"
- I select one page to put out in a basket for the week (for example the first week of August I will put out about 30-40 copies of the square paper in case students want to do it more than once). Then when they go to work on writing, they may choose one of these papers to complete. They need to pick up the paper, head to their seat, and complete the paper.
- When they finish I tell them to put it in the finished work folder or I let them take it home
- Once they are finished with this activity, they can do it again and make something different or choose a different Work On Writing activity.




This is not a pencil. Use your imagination and use the pencil to create something. Write a description of what you invented, what it looks like, and anything else you would like to share







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How to use:

- I. Punch a hole in the top left corner of each "List It!" card. Then put the cards on a ring in numerical order OR cut the cards out and put them in a container for the students to draw out from.
- 2. Tell the students that when they come to WoW, they can choose one of the "List It!" challenges and see if they can come up with a list of what is stated on the card.
- 3. They take the "List It!" challenge card off the hook/out of the container, grab a "List It!" writing paper and head to their seat.
- 4. Then the student fills out the top line of their writing paper. For example if the card says "Write a list of things that are living" then the student will write "My List Of <u>Living Things</u>" on their writing paper. Then they will write down as many things as they can (in this case, as many living things as they can). If they need more paper, they can get another sheet, write the same thing at the top and then continue the list.
- 5. Once they can no longer think of anything else to write on the list, they may take it home/turn it in and start another "List It!" card or another WoW activity.
























Complete the thought...

- How to use:
- I. Punch a hole in the top left corner of each "Complete the Thought...!" card. Then put the cards on a ring in numerical order OR cut the cards out and put them in a container for the students to draw out from.
- 2. Tell the students that when they come to Work on Writing (WoW), they can choose one of the "Complete the Thought..." challenges
- 3. They take the "Complete the Thought..." challenge card off the hook/out of the container, grab a "Complete the Thought..." writing paper and head to their seat.
- 4. Then the student rewrites the sentence on their paper and then completes the rest of the sentence. After the student completes the sentence, he/she continues the story.
- 5. Once they are finished writing the story, they may take it home/turn it in and start another "Compete the Thought" card or another WoW activity.
















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
How to use:

- I. Punch a hole in the top left corner of each "Pen Pals" card. Then put the cards on a ring in numerical order OR cut the cards out and put them in a container for the students to draw out from.
- 2. Tell the students that when they come to Work on Writing (WoW), they can choose one of the "Pen Pals" challenges if they would like.
- 3. They take the "Pen Pals" challenge card off the hook/out of the container, grab a piece of stationary and head to their seat.
- 4. Then the student write their letter to whoever is listed on the Pen Pal challenge card.
- 5. Once they are finished writing the letter, they may give it to their Pen Pal and start another "Pen Pal" card or another WoW activity.











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
How to use:


- I. The following papers included can be used for stationary, lists, complete the thoughts, and/or any other stories.





